While the Preseason High School All-America teams generally highlight the top prospects for the current draft class, there are plenty of players that have been previously named an All-American by Baseball America. Dylan Bundy and Travis Harrison were named to a preseason team as juniors in 2010 while Bundy, Nicky Delmonico, Dillon Maples, Daniel Norris and Henry Owens were named to a 2010 postseason All-America team. All-America ballots are sent to all 30 major league scouting directors as well as USA Baseball and Baseball Factory. Three players transferred after their junior season: Tyler Greene's stats are from Roswell (Ga.) High, Hudson Boyd's are from South High in Fort Myers, Fla. and Taylor Guerrieri's are from North Augusta (S.C.) High.

Swihart is new to both switch-hitting and catching.

Naturally righthanded, he picked up switch-hitting during his sophomore year of high school and only started catching regularly last summer. Before that, Swihart played all around the infield, but has shown natural ability behind the plate with soft hands and a strong throwing arm. Swihart has natural power and a good feel for hitting.

Howard was named the top pitcher of the 2010 Connie Mack World Series, leading the Midland Redskins to the championship. Howard projects to be the first high school player drafted in the first round out of Arkansas since Torii Hunter in 1993.
